As a school we have been working towards these two very important awards: Faith in Action and CAFOD's Live Simply Award.




Faith in Action: Every Year 6 child has now completed and submitted their evidence and will be awarded with their certificates at the Leavers' Mass. Congratulations!


Live Simply: Our School Councillors have worked so hard, taking the lead in this award. As a school we
