Mrs McEniff welcomed us back with a powerful assembly reminding us of our important mission to follow in the footsteps of Jesus living each day to the full.








Please ask your child to share what they know about our school's mission.

Do remember our sacramental programme is available to all children in Year 4, 5 and 6 who have been baptised Catholic or are wishing to enter the faith via Baptism.


Having a say...
