# We gather together:

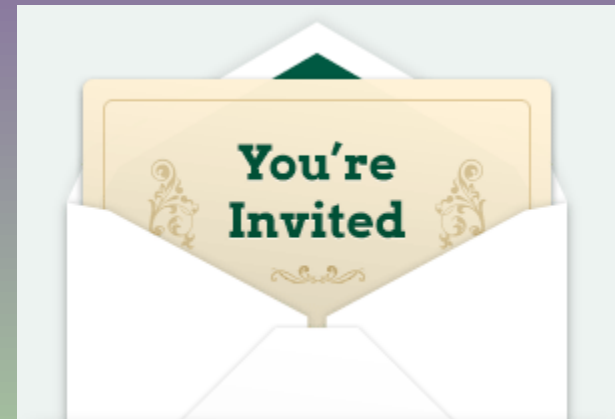
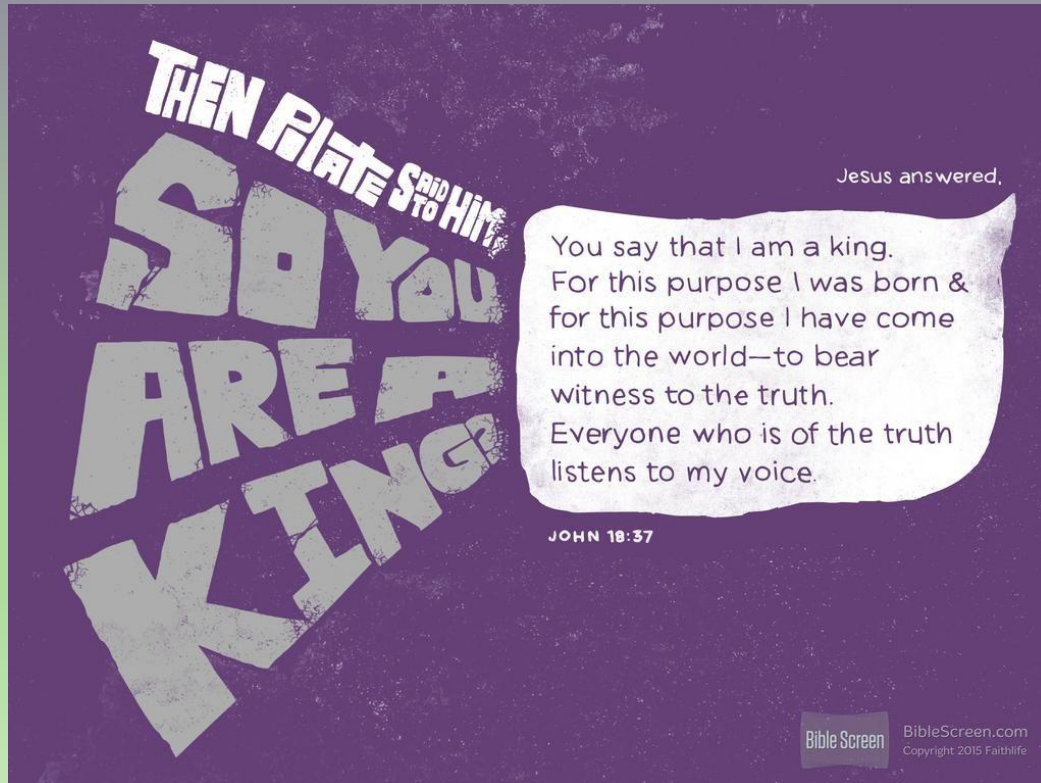


Let us begin by making the sign of the cross together.
